

<u>Science</u>

- Research the life cycle of an owl and then draw and label a diagram to explain it.
- Create a food chain to show the food that owls eat, what those animals eat and which predators eat owls.
- What does it mean to be nocturnal? What other animals are nocturnal?
- Using search engines, look for online documentaries of owls to learn all about them. Once you have found out lots of information about them you could design a leaflet that tells the reader about them.

<u>English</u>

- Tell the story from the mother's point of view. Where has she been? What has she seen? What has she done?
- Write a scary story to explain why the owlets were frightened e.g. a fox attempted to climb the tree.
- Write a character description (in the first person) about one of the owlets.
- Write a diary entry for one of the owlets or the mother owl.
