English


- Create a problem at school that the children are introduced to when they arrive at school, e.g. their Head Teacher has been kidnapped by Madame Chilli. Write a story about it, create a comic strip, storyboard etc.
- Turn Knock Knock Superhero into a short narrative.
- Carry out research into a real-life superhero, then present as a fact-file, presentation or a biography.
- Turn the journey to 'Meatball Mountain' into a fast-paced, tense, piece of descriptive writing.
- Madame Chilli wants everyone's gadgets so she can rule the world. Design your own gadget and then create an 'advert' or a 'Dragons' Den pitch' to persuade Madame Chilli to buy it.
- Write a newspaper article, or present a news report, about the battle between the superheroes and Madame Chilli.
- Write an explanation text or simply a set of instructions to help someone become a superhero,
 e.g. 1. Give yourself a powerful name; 2. Design and make a striking costume; 3. Decide upon a power

Science

- Introduce children to the idea of the different food groups, e.g. carbohydrates, protein, dairy etc, and their effect on the body.
- Learn about healthy and unhealthy foods and design a healthy meal fit for a fictional or real-life superhero.
- 'Meatball Mountain' erupts, just like a volcano. Why not create your own exploding volcano, learning about the chemical reaction that happens when bicarbonate of soda mixes with vinegar.
- In the secret basement room there are lots of switches. Learn how to add switches to circuits and what they do.

Geography

- There are different types of mountain that can be found all over the world. Research them and create a presentation or fact-file about each one.
- Write an explanation text or create an animation to explain how different mountains are formed.
- When 'Meatball Mountain' erupts, characters surf on the meatball sauce. What happens when real volcanoes erupt? How does it affect life in the area?
- The Supersonic Supercar is swept up by a tidal wave. Write an explanation text or create an animation to explain what a tidal wave is and how it happens.

- What makes a 'hero'?
- Who is your hero?
- What makes a good team?

Maths

- Create your own poem to help you remember a difficult times-table.
- Ratio: using recipes of favourite pasta dishes, work out how to scale up and down to make the dish for different numbers of people.
- Using a collection of toy cars, measure the distance that each travels and create a bar chart to show which travels the furthest.
- Practise your measuring skills by measuring out different ingredients or solving different measurement problems.
- Using Miniature Heroes chocolates, create a bar chart to show the number of different types chocolates in the box. You can then draw it as a pictogram or a bar chart.
- If you are in year's 5 or 6, you could work out the percentage of different chocolates in a box of Miniature Heroes and present the data in a pie chart!

Art/DT

- Design your own superhero costume.
- Design your own cape or gloves for your superhero to wear. If you have material available, you could make them!
- Lots of superheroes where masks to hide their true identity. Create your own!
- It's Junior Bake-Off time! Design a meal for Pasta Man! You can even cook it and upload your concoctions to your school's social media site.
- There is a secret room in the basement of the house.
 Design your own secret underground room.
- Create your own 'Supersonic Supercar' for your own superhero to travel in.
